A church in Boston cancelled worship services this month and posted the sign "Due to the Global Warming crisis, worship in Sanctuary 9-17-23 Cancelled" (NY Post 09-25-2023). Hurricane Lee had been predicted to hit Boston by some, but not most models. Thankfully, the storm veered out to sea.

We live in an age of manufactured crisis and the North American church has been complicit in supporting instead of contending for the truth. The culture in which we live has defined the Gospel as ignorant, arrogant, bigoted, and naive. We have largely been intimidated into silence.




