Notes From the Pastor's Desk . . . February, 2024

I am thankful for the last few days. The Lord has given me a vision of the holiness we are to pursue as a congregation. In the vows of ordination, a Methodist pastor is asked if they are going on to perfection in love. We answer "Yes!" The more difficult question to answer is "Do you expect to be made perfect in this lifetime?" We are expected to answer affirmatively.

Christian perfection is a greatly misunderstood and ignored doctrine. It does not mean absence of sin. Matthew 5:48 records Jesus saying "You therefore must be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect." How is this possible? We are not God.

The context for Jesus' statement is the Beatitudes. The verses immediately preceding Matthew 5:48 help us to understand the meaning of our Lord's words.

43 "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' 44 But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, 45 so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven. For He makes His sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust. 46 For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Do not even the tax collectors do the same? 47 And if you greet only your brothers, what more are you doing than others? Do not even the Gentiles do the same? (Matthew 5)

Jesus would not issue a command that is unattainable. Our lack of confidence is not to be an excuse for failing to strive. As I said in the sermon Sunday, "We have been part of a denomination of low expectations and we are a congregation that has embraced low expectations." We fail to attain because we do not strive in the confidence that God's grace is sufficient. Jesus loved His enemies. He hated evil instead of tolerating it because He loved those oppressed by sin. We make peace with the enemy saying, "I will compromise or ignore if you leave me alone." The Enemy promises and then begins to press for more compromise until we forget who we are and to whom we belong.

Over the next several weeks beginning February 18, the first Sunday in Lent, I will preach on living and loving like Jesus. Join in this pursuit of holiness in heart and life that is the life of a disciple of Christ.

2 Corinthians 4:8-10 states (NIV) We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed. We always carry around in our body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our body.

We are not crushed. We are not defeated. We are not abandoned. The pressing that the enemy would try to bring to us is meant to crush us. The perplexing issues we face every day, the questions of why are meant to put us in despair. The battles we fight, the people who rail against us make us feel abandoned. When the enemy pushes us down, we don't want to get back up; yet, within us we carry the beauty of Jesus - His resurrection, His insurmountable unbelievable power. Our Savior, who still FIGHTS and WINS FOR US is the ultimate recycler. In this World, where there is so much against us, we feel all these negative words in this scripture but that is the enemy whispering in our ears. Gods states WE ARE NOT CRUSHED, WE ARE NOT IN DES-PAIR, WE ARE NOT ABANDONED WE ARE LOVED, FOR-**GIVEN, PRECIOUS, PRICELESS, WARRIORS, VICTORIOUS,** CHOSEN AND RECYCLEDby the ONE who gave His all for us. So, if today the enemy has come to whisper in your ear that your sickness, your trial, your money problems, your hurt, your pain is going to overtake you, quote 2 Corinthians 4:8-10 out loud and remember you are not crushed... you are recycled to be used again for the pouring out of the Master. What the enemy has meant for evil, God will turn around for your good. WE ARE OVERCOMERS BY THE BLOOD OF THE LAMB AND THE WORD OF OUR TESTIMONY.

please contact Annie Hillman. As of right now, the Youth are planning several more fundraising opportunities and a fun trip to the **Uncle**




